






HARD HATS FOR LITTLE HEADS

Together, we gave 26,768 bike helmets to children and youth (aged 3-14) to prevent brain injury and encourage physical activity.

BE WISE – IMMUNIZESM

Together, we protected Texans of all ages from preventable diseases by giving **26,571 vaccinations**.



WALK WITH A DOC TEXAS

Together, we helped nearly **17,000 people** increase their regular physical activity by participating in exercise walks with TMA physicians, medical students and residents.

MINORITY SCHOLARSHIPS

Thirteen outstanding minority students entering Texas medical schools each received a **\$10,000 scholarship**.

SCIENCE TEACHING AWARDS

Eleven exceptional teachers and their schools were awarded **\$60,000** to recognize and support outstanding science learning in Texas elementary, middle school, and high school classrooms.

COMMUNITY-BASED HEALTH INITIATIVES

We funded **20 community health improvement programs** led by TMA County Medical Societies and Alliance chapters, as well as medical student chapters.

COMMUNITY-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

In addition to funding TMA Minority Scholarships, TMA Foundation provided **\$57,100 in scholarship funds** to TMA County Medical Society and Alliance programs that support deserving medical and nursing students in communities throughout Texas.

CHAMPION OF HEALTH AWARD

Dallas nonprofit **Promise of Peace Gardens** was awarded the 2019 John P. McGovern Champion of Health Award for its **Soup It Forward** program, which provides monthly ingredients and recipes for soups benefiting 150 families living in food deserts. Families tend community gardens, learn how to grow nutritious vegetables, and engage with neighbors. The program benefits **600 people** annually and includes cooking classes and children's programs.
