"Family of Funds" supports the philanthropic aspirations of TMA and TMAA members and TMA's vision to improve the health of all Texans. The TMAF Hispanic Nursing Scholarship Trust Fund of Dr. Roberto and Agniela (Annie) Bayardo is the first initiative established under the new "Family of Funds." The trust fund awarded six nursing scholarships in 2017.

TMAF's first matching grant was awarded to a Tarrant County Medical Society program that provides uncompensated specialty care to area uninsured and working poor. The \$10,000 grant attracted an equal amount of support from individual donors, enabling more Texans to receive care.

BUILDING Better Health

17,375 TMA Be Wise — ImmunizeSM shots protected Texans from preventable diseases.

28,817 TMA Hard Hats for Little Heads Helmets protected youth from head injury.

11,700 Walk with a Doc Texas participants at **39** walk sites created the habit of regular walking for better health.

12 TMA Minority Scholarship recipients, the "Bayardo Scholars," each received a \$10,000 Texas medical school scholarship.

12 TMA Ernest and Sarah Butler Awards for Excellence in Science Teaching winners and their schools received cash awards to further engage young Texans in scientific inquiry.

Spanish translation of TMA's exhibit, <u>Deep Roots: Botanical Medicine from Plants</u> to <u>Prescriptions</u> expanded the audience of this display.

9 grants to TMA county medical societies and alliance and medical student chapters protected adults from the flu, provided specialty care to uninsured Texans, made fitness classes available to underserved families — and more.

2 programs were recognized for outstanding efforts to improve the health of their community with the TMAF John P. McGovern Champion of Health Award.

FUNDING Better Health

1,374 <u>individuals</u> and **85** <u>institutions</u> generously donated nearly **\$2.3** <u>million</u> **dollars** in **2017**, surpassing the goal of **\$912,950** by **151** percent!

TMAF granted a record \$968,933. Of this total:

\$877,981 supported 10 TMA health improvement, quality of care, and science and education programs, including TMA's Disaster Relief Program in the wake of Hurricane Harvey.

\$90,952 supported 10 county medical society, alliance and medical student chapter community health initiatives, nursing scholarships and TMAF's Champion of Health Award.



GIVING Better Health

26 new and upgraded Major Donors were honored at TMA's Winter Conference.

24 top donors to <u>TMA's Minority Scholarship Program</u> were matched with **12 scholarship recipients**.

12 institutions reached milestone levels of support and were recognized with a TMAF Corporate Leadership Circle Award.

142 individuals contributed \$1,000 or more to become Leadership Society members.

53 TMA Alliance members donated \$3,030 to TMAF through its annual Holiday Sharing Card campaign.

401 guests attended the 2017 gala, raising \$325,000 for a Healthy Now and a Healthy Future.


